This checklist covers the basics that should be included in any skipper's predeparture process. This list is not exhaustive and is provided to guide novice and trainee skippers to help them develop their processes. PASSAGE & PILOTAGE PLANS Have prepared a passage plan including pilotage for ports of exit and entry & potential places or ports of refuge. **ENGINE CHECK** Have run through an engine check including basic oil and water levels. FUEL & WATER LEVELS Have checked the levels of both fuel and fresh water. VITAILING Have enough food and supplies for the number of people & amount of time on board. SAFETY EOUIPMENT Have checked the location and condition of safety equipment on board. DECK EQUIPMENT Have checked the deck equipment including anchor tackle and running rigging. NAVIGATION CHARTS Have appropriate navigation charts for the sea area including electronic navigation charts. **INSTRUMENTS** Have checked the instruments including chart plotter and VHF radio. NAVIGATION LIGHTS Have checked the navigation lights are functioning as expected. WEATHER FORECAST Have obtained an up to date weather forecast. **CREW SAFTEY BRIEFING** Have briefed the crew on safety including a nominated person as first mate. MEDICAL & NEXT OF KIN DETAILS Have obtained any medical needs of the crew and collected next of kin details. INFORMED SHORE CONTACT Have informed the appointed shore contact of plans and estimated time of
